From the Vicar's Desk

To the faithful believers of St. John's Mar Thoma Church, Michigan Dearly beloved in Christ,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

Kudosh Eetho: New Year in the Church

In the liturgical terms, the month of November is especially important. We know that December and the Christmas season is especially important for us. But one thing that we learn from the way our feasts and festivals are arranged by the church is that the celebrations of festivals like "Feast of the Nativity of our Lord" (Yeldo meaning "Nativity" in Syriac; or Christmas, meaning "Christ's Mass" in Latin) involve a time of preparation of our bodies, minds, and hearts. It is not just of the Advent time that begins our preparation for this celebration. On October 30, we celebrate Kudosh Eetho, "Sanctification of the Church". This actually marks the beginning of the liturgical year. We are familiar with the new year celebration on January 1, or the new year each one of us celebrates during our birthdays, and maybe even the Chinese New Year or the Malayalam New year (First day of month of Chingam). But how many of us are familiar with the beginning of the liturgical year followed by the Mar Thoma Church? Koodos Eetho and Hoodos Eetho ("Renewal of the Church") are two celebrations in which we prepare ourselves for the remembrance of the incarnation of Jesus Christ on December 25th.

Rev. Dr. George Mathew Kuttiyil writes, "The Church signifies here the time when the Church, the heavenly bride, sanctifies herself to receive the Lord, the heavenly bridegroom. (see A Study of the Fasts and Feasts in the Church)" Each of us must have an understanding of how our lives have to be reordered in the light of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Yes, we must live and work in this world. But they must not live as the people of this world. Instead, we must recognize that every moment of our life has to focus on Jesus Christ. Let us sanctify our hearts and minds in order that we may be ready to welcome our Lord

God's Animation Project: Parish Retreat Theme Review

I praise God once again for being able to be part of our first Parish Retreat. The objective of the meditations was to bring our bodies, hearts, and minds to the deliberative and conscious attention to the presence of God among us. Often we feel disconnected with God, even though we are so busy "doing things" for God. Meditating on Genesis 2:4-9, we learned about "God's Animation Project" which was in the creation of all things and then in the crown jewel of His creation, men and women. The whole world was made according to God's plan. In humans, God used the divine breath to give us life. All things were made for us and for our benefit. We also have a responsibility, whether in family, workplace, school, or church. But the progress of life can dull us. The next meditation was based on Ezekiel 37:1-14, titled, "God's Re -Animation Project". In Ezekiel's vision of the valley of dry bones, we see God asking him if the bones can be made alive. Ezekiel answers, "O Lord, you know." And the Lord does revive the bones by the power of His breath, which is His Word. The Word of God is re-animating. That is why reading the Bible is so important in our lives today. In the last meditation, from John 11:38-44, titled "God Reanimates: Calling by Name", we see Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. He called the dead man by name and he arose. Once again, we see the voice of God, the Creator of all things, calling His children by name and drawing them to Him. We see his tender love and care, calling each person by name and filling them with His Holy Spirit. God desires to be with us. He desires that we know Him. Let us seek him as He is seeking us. Let us return to him, as he calls us by name. The Bible and prayer fellowship with God and our worship together as a church bring revival into our hearts and souls. Let us move forward energized by His Spirit.

We now approach the end of the calendar year. The Thanksgiving and Christmas season will be with us shortly. Let us work together to plan our Christmas Carol Service and the Caroling Rounds so that they are a time of happiness and celebration of the Birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. We also have to prayerfully gather to select parishioners for different leadership positions. Let us understand our needs and let each one take on the necessary responsibilities for the strengthening of our parish. We also have the task of closing the administrative year so let us all do that in a smooth and timely manner. May the Holy Spirit strengthen us to carry out our responsibilities, for His glory. The Unchanging Changing God

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. – Heb 13:8

For I the Lord do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, have not perished. – Malachi 3:6.

We are all creatures of habit. When we find a good seat in the church, then next Sunday, if possible, we will aim for that same area. If we find a good restaurant, we are more likely to return there than try something brand new. We enjoy the comfort of the familiar. We find peace in the predictable. On the other hand, change is often a disturbance. Change may take away from the joy we currently experience. Our sense of reliability and trust is questioned when things change.

As Christians, we talk about our unchanging God as our anchor in this ever-changing world. But we must also remember that the Bible teaches us that in some ways God changes too! For example, God regretted making humans (Gen 6:6) after seeing how wicked they act. A more positive example is when God changed his mind about Nineveh's destruction (Jonah 3:10) after they repented. Another, the prophet Joel preaches that if the people turn back, then they can have hope that God would change and relent from punishing the people (Joel 2:13-14).

Christmas is a time to realize just how much he changed for our sake. The theological word for that change is "incarnation". Jesus became human for our sake. When we say God never changes, we mean he is always love. And as every parent knows, love causes us to move in different ways for the sake of our children. God is compassionate and is moved by his love for us. When Jesus came into this world, the shock of God in human form was too much of a change for some people to accept. I pray that we learn to seek the God who cares so much about us that he would change himself, so that he could change us! Thank God for another Advent season in which we can reflect God's incarnational change to a world in need of transformation.




