From the Vicar's Desk

To the faithful believers of St. John's Mar Thoma Church, Michigan Dearly beloved in Christ,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

The start of the autumn season is a 180-degree shift from the experience of the previous months. We see some drastic changes around us. The world changes completely and all creatures make their adaptations. The migrating birds pick up their pace southwards, the squirrels pack on weight, and us humans bring our winter clothes from the storage space. The poet Robert Frost penned these words describing the changes: *O hushed October morning mild, Thy leaves have ripened to the fall; Tomorrow's wind, if it be wild, Should waste them all* ("October," 1915). There is calmness in the wintertime; the cold slows down the world. But maybe it is a time for us to slow down and reflect on the days gone by. Soon we will be at the year's end but may the remaining days of this year be a time to reflect on how things have been and prepare for a new year.

Proclaiming Christ Yesterday, Today, & Tomorrow

It is in this slowing down of time that we in the United States approach the upcoming days. In the Calendar of the Church, we have the Sanctification of the Church on 3rd Nov. (Kudosh Eetho) and the Renewal of the Church on 10th Nov. (Hudosh Eetho). Just before that is All Saint's Day on 1st November. We remember the righteous who have gone before us, reflect on their words and admonitions, and we attempt to follow in their footsteps. They followed the Lord Jesus faithfully in their time in this world; let us also continue to be strong in our walk with God. The period known as Subaro (Annunciation) marks the time of divine announcements of the coming of the Lord Jesus. The Annunciations to Zechariah, to the Virgin Mary, to Joseph, etc. belong to the proclamation of God's salvation plan. The salvation plan culminated with the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, the Son of God and its climax was on the Cross. Today, there remains for us to understand what God has done for us as we wait for the final act of God's plan, which is the fulfillment of the Kingdom of God and the Second Coming of the Lord Jesus. Today, many say that the end-times are near; in fact, the end-time is already here. The glorious Resurrection of Jesus Christ and His Ascension have marked an inflection point in world history. Those who trust in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior have the surety of eternal life with God. It is the role of the Church, that is, as a community of believers in the Lord Jesus, to make this truth known to all. There are those in our families and communities who don't understand this message; it is our duty to show them the wonder of what God has done. There are those who have fallen away from the faith; it is to them that we try to show the marvel of God's work.

Looking Back, Looking Ahead


